While some institutions have offered professional development programs through organizations like the Illinois Online Network, little is known about the impact of such programs on teaching effectiveness *(instructor and student success)



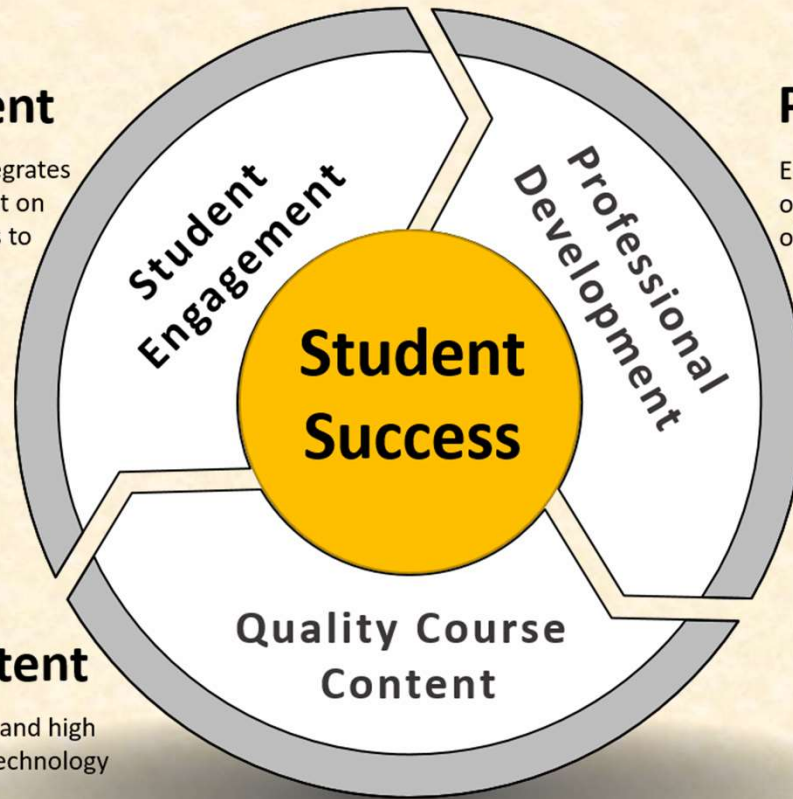
Discuss the relationship between faculty online teaching professional development and teaching effectiveness.

Professional Development

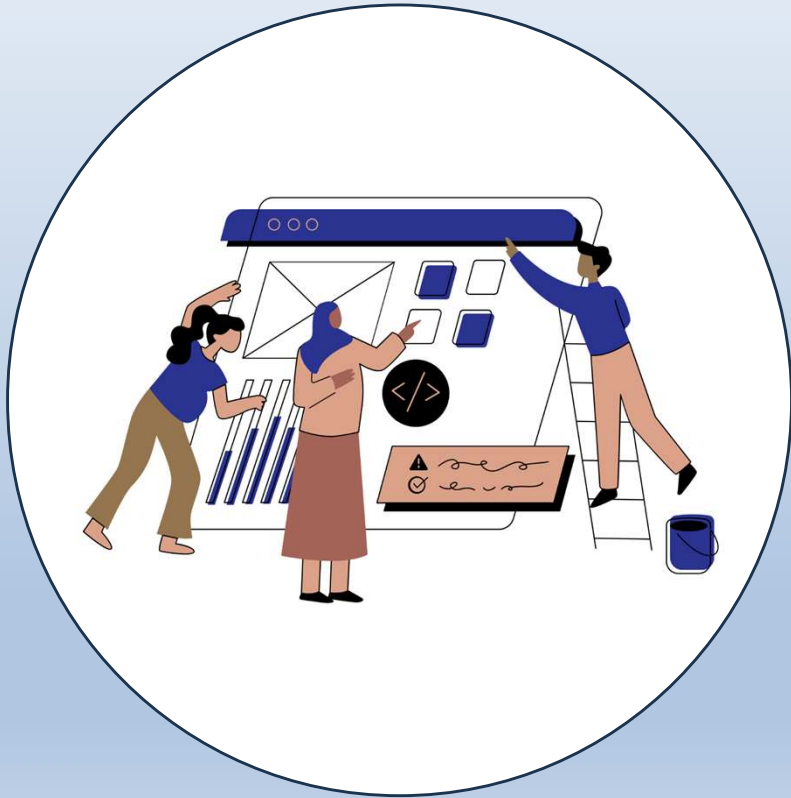
Engage faculty and staff in professional learning opportunities intended to facilitate implementation of digital learning technology.

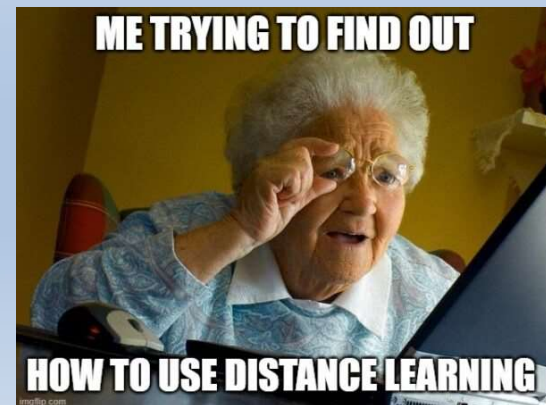

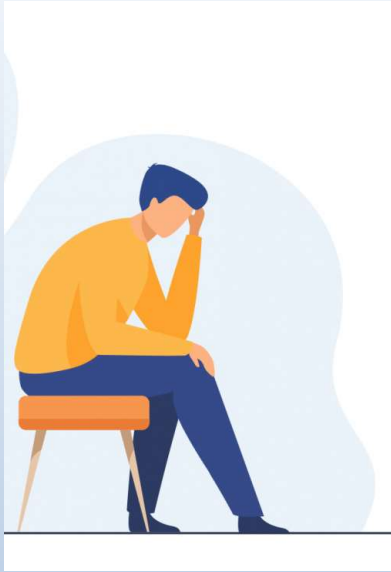

Professional Development for Everyone

60.0% of the teaching staff at are part-time non-faculty or non-tenure track faculty. This use of adjuncts is on par with the national average of 51.4%

Professional Development for Everyone

A study of teachers who taught both online and face-to-face reported that 75% of the survey respondents indicated that teaching online had a positive impact on their face-to-face teaching. (McQuiggan)

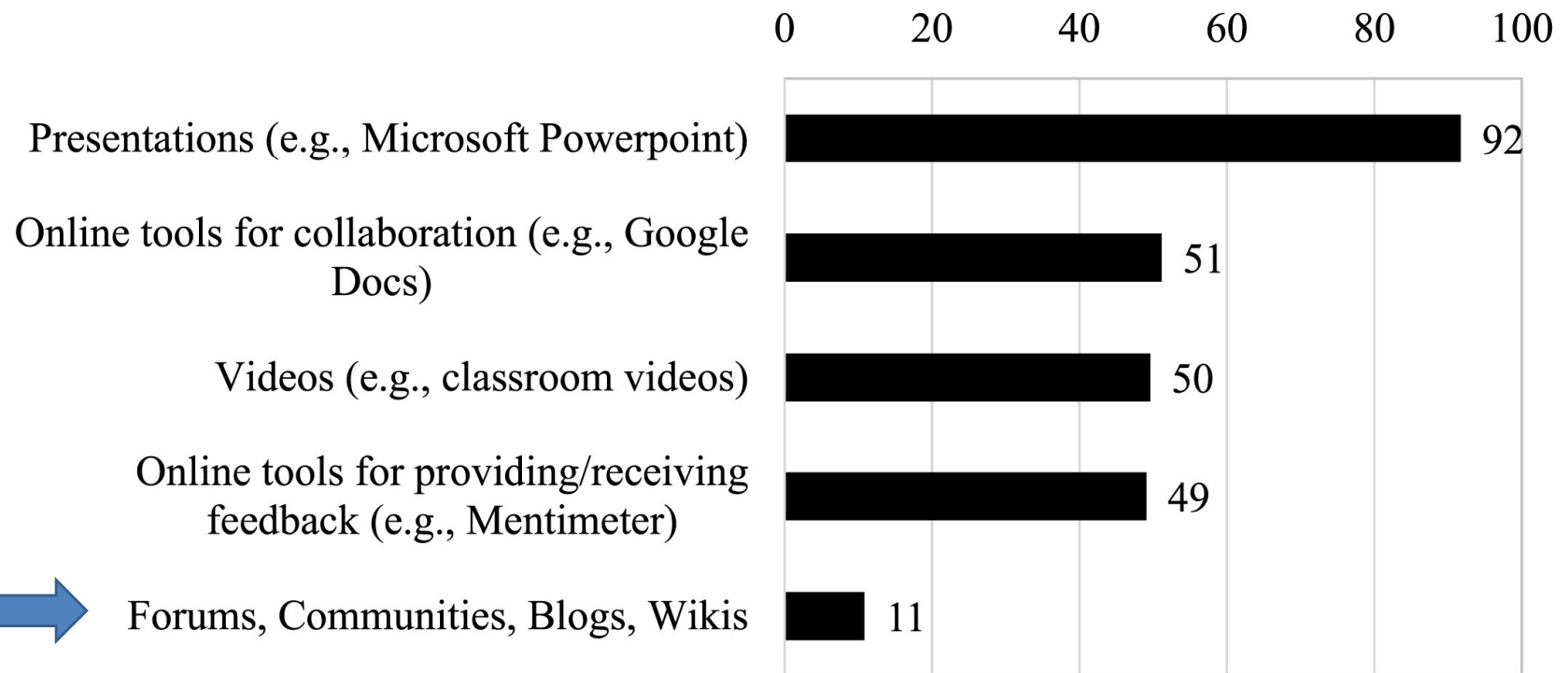

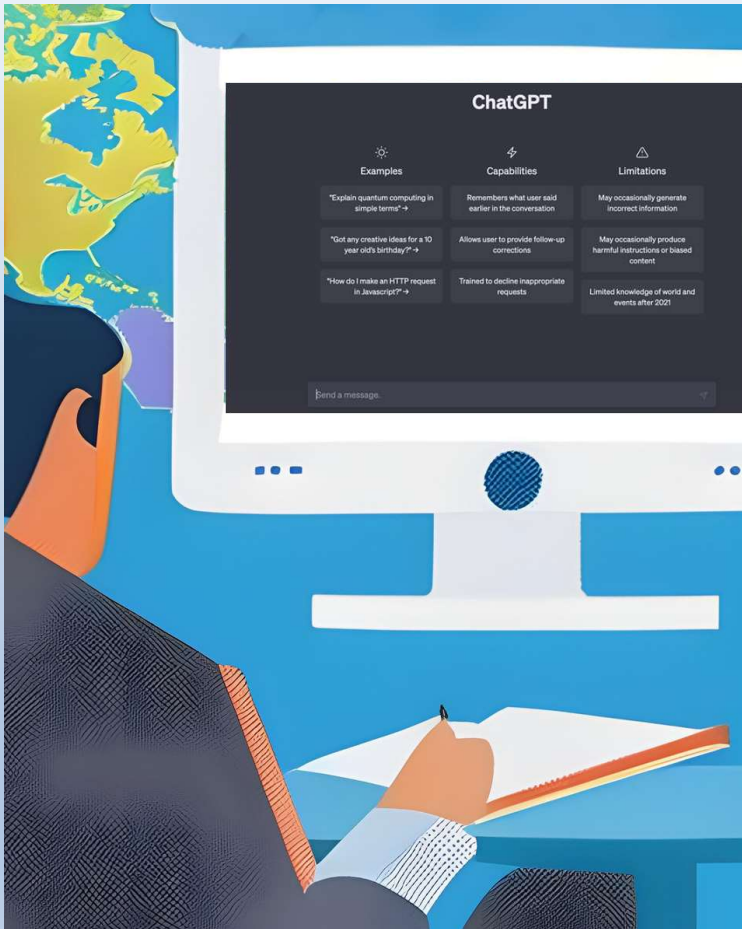

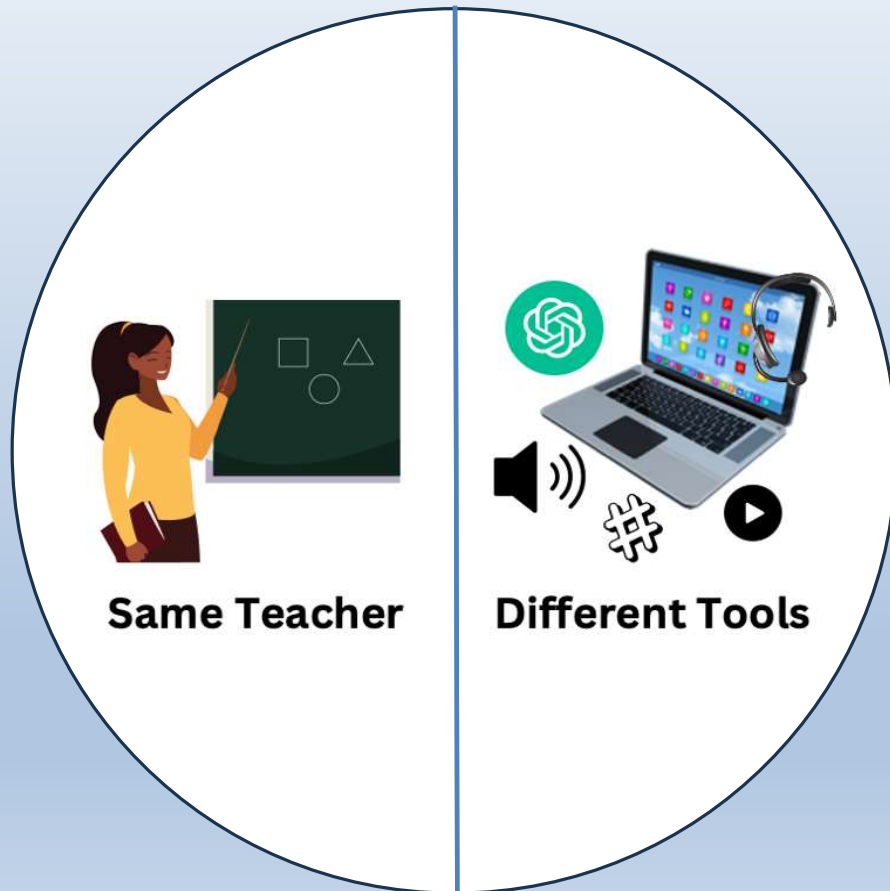
The Future of Online Teaching

Online is Growing



- Seventy-three percent of adults thought online education was the same or better at meeting the needs of traditional students, up from 40 percent who believed that in 2017. (Coffey)
- Eighty-four percent believe employers are more accepting of online degrees today than they were pre-pandemic. (Coffey)
- About 80 percent stated they would consider an online program if they were enrolling in an undergraduate or post graduate program. (Coffey)

Online is Growing

- With growth comes responsibility
- 36 percent believe online is the best value, 32 percent said on-campus is best and 32 percent said they provide roughly the same value. (Coffey)

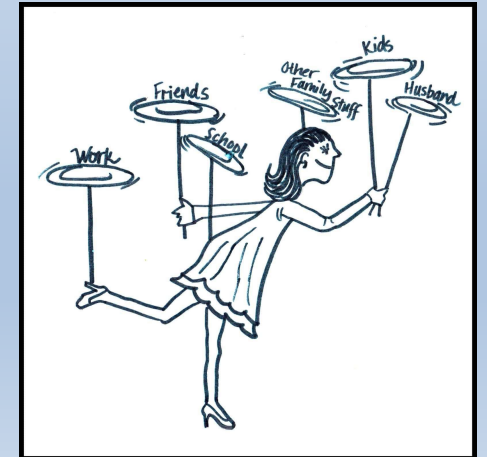

“The traditional, residential, in-person-only system intrinsically denies access to those without the means and resources necessary to enter the system and inherently perpetuates inequities in access.”

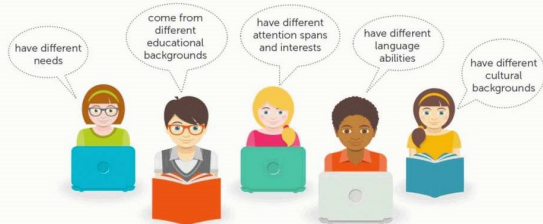

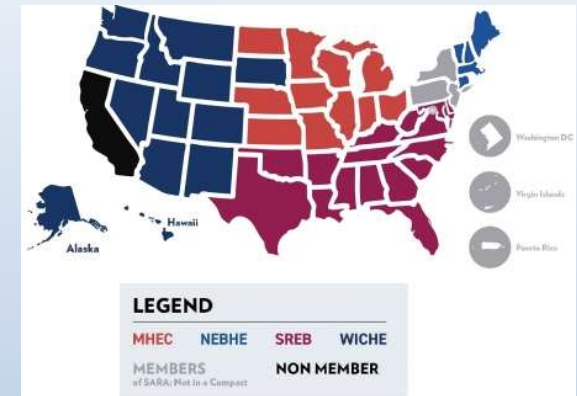

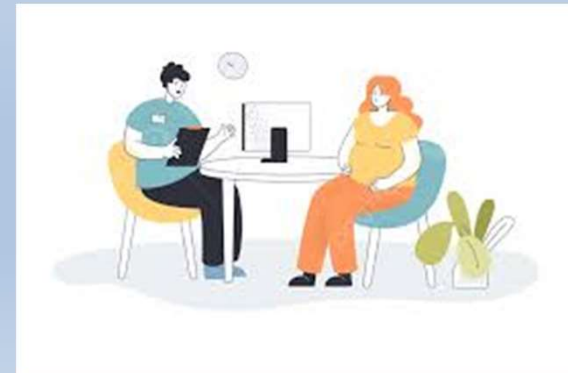


Benefits of Professional Development
